The senseless death of George Floyd in the custody of police and the resulting anger over another senseless killing has created sadness and outrage across our nation spilling out into the streets of our communities. Dr. Martin Luther King said, "*Riots are the message of the unheard*."

In this horrific moment we have but yet another opportunity to listen to and definitively address inequities and disproportionate enforcement in our Black and Brown communities that have once again come to the forefront in the shadow of COVID-19.
